
CÓRDOBA CITY LANDMARKS

Córdoba City has several landmarks to visit, we want to show you the ones selected as part of the skyline we chose.



Córdoba Arc

The Arc of Córdoba is a work of art located in the southeast sector of the city of Córdoba, Argentina. Its origin dates back to 1942 during the administration of Donato Latella Frías.



Eiffel Wheel

Made almost entirely of wrought iron, it is 27 meters in diameter and has 20 cabins with 6 seats each, this wheel took 20 minutes to turn each turn. It is an example of typical iron engineering or architecture from the late 19th and early 20th centuries.



San Martin's Monument

Honors to the greatest Argentine hero in the independence of America, with an equestrian sculpture built in 1916. The statue also remembers those who fell in the liberation feat. The work is by the Italian sculptor Juan Scarabelli.



Monument located in Sarmiento Park, Córdoba, Argentina It stands 335 feet (102 m). It was created as a tribute to the Argentina Bicentennial.

THREE BARS

We find 3 bars in the center that join at the bottom. They symbolise multiple elements of the encounter.

The number three:

- It is the third Regional Conference.
- The 3 geographical subregions of the continent.

The bars join at the bottom pointing to the South of the continent, where the Regional Conference will be held, the Argentine Republic.

The bars form the letter "W", first letter of "Western" word, representing the region.




In the background we have a yellow sun, formed by a large circle; and the rays formed with a hexagonal edge.

The sun is a central icon in the cultures of the continent's indigenous.


The circle also represents the letter "O", in Spanish the initial letter of "Occidental" representing the region.
