Proposals for amendments to the Western Hemisphere MOU (by the WHR Committee and Member countries)

A two-thirds majority of the votes cast is required for amendments to the MOU (Paragraph 12.2 of the MOU)

Article 4. Languages 4.1 The official languages of the Western Hemisphere Region are those laid down in the ISGF Constitution and Bye-Laws. Spanish will also be an official language within the Western Hemisphere Region.	Brazil: Taking in consideration the number of Spanish speaking country members, we recommend to adopt Spanish as an official language within the Region. Argentina: Based on the number of Spanish speaking countries of the continent as well as the number of members who speaks Spanish as a primary or alternative language. The AISG website permanently incorporates Spanish newsletters and translation of most of Our kit's books in this language, for the very important work carried out by the Cervantes Program. Uruguay: Spanish is the common language of Central/South America and the large islands of the Spanish-speaking Caribbean. Brazilians can understand Spanish quite easily. In addition, most people in those areas are not proficient in English or French. Chile: Add this point as the urgent and obviously needing of understanding for the many members whom don't speak any of the two official ISGF languages existing within the WH Region WHRCom: Taking in consideration the number of Spanish speaking country members in the WH, we also recommend to adopt Spanish as an official language.

This can be achieved by eliminating the position of Vice-President. This is also the original composition of de Region Committee that was proposed in the first draft MOU. WHRCom: The functioning of the Committee has been efficiently with 4 members, so we don't see the need for changing.
