Dear friends!

We thought it will be very interesting to share with you the letter below sent by the scouts in BRØNNØYSUND (Norway). They had support from IAG for their international camp last year. They had a training focused on environment, take care of the nature and how to handle the waist and Garbage during the camp. It was quite a challenge for them and they had many fruitful discussions with scouts from the other countries.

We are a large scout/guide group with around 100 members. We were founded in August 1984 as Brønnøyspeiderne KFUK-KFUM (Brønnøy scouts YWCA-YMCA).

For the past 21 years we have had a unit called the Makalause (the Special Unit) who are scouts/guides of all ages who have special needs/impediments. Anyone can be included here. We are a gang of around 30, where more than 20 are disabled. In addition to normal scouting activities, we sing, play music and perform, both locally and at wider scout events.

Otherwise, we have the equivalent of beavers/rainbows, cubs/brownies, scouts/guides and rovers/rangers. All units take part in a trip in the autumn, a large jumble sale in the autumn, a Peace Light service, a skiing trip to Hermavann in February and usually an arrangement on St George's Day. In addition, all take part in the annual summer camp, which in 2020 will be a district camp at Valnesfjord.

We also have extensive cooperation with scouts and guides in many countries, first and foremost in Sri Lanka and northern Russia, but also in Poland, Burundi, Germany, Denmark and Sweden. Every second or third year, a group of us visit Poland, Russia or – most often – Sri Lanka. Those who go are scouts/guides (10-15-year olds), rovers/rangers and the Makalause. We have a camp site in Sri Lanka that we in praxis own, though we are not the formal owners.

In addition, we have a school for the disabled in Sri Lanka together with the Norwegian branch of Y Global, «Makalause Dream School». At present there are fifteen pupils and two teachers. The school also functions as a resource centre for scouting and for the disabled. There are now four scout/guide groups for the disabled in Sri Lanka, and we expect the fifth will soon be established. There is also a large scout/guide group for the disabled in Burundi, which is also called Makalause.

We have weekly meetings for the scouts/guides in addition to trips, while the other units have meetings each fortnight in addition to trips, and the Makalause also hold concerts. Every two or three years, the Makalause visit Spain in the autumn and hold concerts and services in the Norwegian and Swedish Seamen's Church and Mission.

At present we run a second-hand shop, in addition to applying for funds from many sources in order to maintain the activities we have. The shop is only open three days a week, because we don't have staff to keep it open more often.

That's a bit about us and our «madness»!
