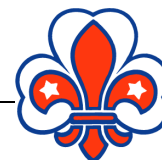

<p>FASGU members - when invited by local Scout Groups regardless of whether they are affiliated with any association or are independent - actively participate in their festivities, presentations, and camps.</p> <p>Members of our Fellowship engage every year in an annual International Scout Gathering, playing the necessary tasks in the organization, monitoring, and control of a multinational camp where young Scouts from Argentina, Brazil, and Uruguay meet.</p> <p>FASGU officially supports and participates to our best capacities in all campaigns organized by the local WOSM Young Scouts Association, namely Movimiento Scout del Uruguay (MSU).</p> <p>FASGU has twice (in 2007 and 2012) promoted and co-organized massive Scouting events, which aim to fraternally unite all Scouting organizations in our country despite occasional differences.</p> <p>No Guiding organizations exist at the moment in Uruguay.</p>

<p>Campaigns to help individuals (children with unusual illness, elder in need of a special treatment).</p> <p>Campaigns to support organizations : Uruguayan Scout Movement's donation of school uniforms, books and supplies; COOPTICA's permanent program in collecting used glasses for those who cannot afford new frames.</p> <p>Direct assistance to "Merendero Baloo" and to Merendero Solidar" ("merendero" is a non-for-profit canteen that provides a meal on a periodical basis (daily, weekly) to children in poverty status in the neighborhood) through the contribution of hours of work and donation of bedclothes, coats, medicines, drinking water, food, etc.</p>	



<p>Participation in "Casa del Migrante" (Migrant Home) activities, supporting their temporary reception and protection of economic, social, and political migrants from Latin America.</p>
<p>Support to a Project</p> <p>FASGU signed a cooperation alliance with MUDE (Uruguayan Scouting Museum), to support their project on the collection, classification, inventory, protection, investigation, and exhibit of the Uruguayan Scout heritage.</p> <p>FASGU and MUDE are committed to care of the numerous donations.</p> <p>We attend the museum - when open to the public - to guide visitors, and we keep an exhibit cabinet, to display our own heritage.</p>
<p>Support to Fellowship Day</p> <p>FASGU commemorates the Fellowship Day by meeting face-to-face and/or via Zoom.</p> <p>We upload a flyer on social media to encourage our members to be close to other ISGF members via telephone calls or Zoom meetings.</p> <p>During the 2025 Fellowship Day we will take the Adult Scout Promise to new members.</p>
<p>Thinking / Founders Day</p> <p>We participate by uploading commemorating flyers on social media.</p>
