

Important Dates for the Region

In 1987, at the 17th General Assembly held in Coventry England, the inauguration of world Regions was decided. Asian –Pacific Region was the one.

In 1971 the 9th General Assembly took place in Melbourne Australia, first time out of Europe, to demonstrate the world wide nature of the organisation as well as the wish to develop South East Asia.

In 1978 a Committee for the Asian-Pacific Region was coming along in order to promote meetings, exchanges, visits, and actions for development within Australia, India, Indonesia, New Zealand, Philippines and Pakistan.

In 1985 the 16th General Assembly was held in Christchurch, New Zealand

In 1993 the 20th General Assembly was held in Yogyakarta, Indonesia

In 1999 the 22nd World Conference was held in New Delhi, India. Priority was given to the development of the Asian –Pacific and Maghreb.

In 2014 the 27th World Conference was held in Sydney, Australia

In 2017 the 28th World Conference will be held in Bali , Indonesia

CONSTITUTION : The 1st Constitution of the Region was adopted in Dhaka, Bangladesh on 9 November 2012, during the 13th ASPAC Gathering

History of ASPAC as provided by Brian Jackson (Australia)

In 1967 New Zealand joined followed by Bangladesh in 1979, Malaysia in 1985, Indonesia in 1997 and finally Maldives in 2014. Pakistan had their membership cancelled in 1987 but they were reinstated in 1989. The first Asia Pacific Conference was held in Sri Lanka in 1974 and it was the first time that 3 Asian countries were able to send representatives to a Regional Conference and they included India and Sri Lanka, while the second in New Zealand in 1976 consisted of only Australia and New Zealand members. The 3rd Conference in Australia in 1978 consisted of Australia, New Zealand and 1 from Indonesia.

1974 26th-29th July Colombo Sri Lanka

The inaugural meeting was organised by the Mr. J.C. Nilgiria president of Sri Lanka Former Scouts and Miss Daya de Silva president of the Trefoil Guild and this was the first meeting of the members of the Asia Pacific region with members from Sri Lanka (46) India, Pakistan, Philippines and Australia with an observer from Norway. The meeting was held in Girl Guide headquarters Colombo and the opening address was given by Her Excellency Mrs. Gopallawa and the St. Anthony's Convent school band played the national Anthem. Her Excellency was introduced to the delegates and Chief Commissioners. As the United Nations had designated 1974 as World Population Year the theme for the meeting was "Role of the Youth in World Population Year". The chairman Mr. Nilgiria welcomed those present and spoke of the aspirations of IFOFSAG and the purpose of the regional meetings in fostering friendship between our respective countries. Good wishes were received from Secretary

General of IFOFSAG plus India, Pakistan, Australia and New Zealand. Guest speakers were: His Excellency Mr. William Gopallawa, President of Sri Lanka, Mrs. Molina Dutt International Secretary IFOFSAG, Mrs Sornartham Meeting secretary, Mr. C.M.P. Wanigatunga Chief Commissioner Boy Scouts of Sri Lanka, Miss R. Wijesekera, Mr. D.L.M. Karunaratne, Mr. Shah FOFSAG Bombay, Mr. Qasi Pakistan, Mr. Ali Abdullah Pakistan, Mrs Manel Ralasureiya, Mrs Shirley Perera. The FOFSAG of Sri Lanka were given a couple of projects to follow up on and they were: Cattle breeding for consumption and export, Cotton growing for production and export, Fishing for production and export, Hydro Electricity for reducing the consumption of fuel. The meetings were covered by press, Sri Lanka broadcasting corporation and press photographers. The parting words of the chairman were **“Parting is when one feels one loses the friendship for a time but, that friendship will burn throughout one’s life “**. There was no committee elected or any mention of who will host the next meeting

1976 05th-8th March Auckland New Zealand

Only Australia and New Zealand members were in attendance along with Dr Sutarman from Indonesia and with Mr. Eric Morley (International Secretary Baden Powell Guild United Kingdom). It was decreed that another Gathering was needed to be held in 2 or 4 years because of the success of the New Zealand one and because of the proximity to Australia of places such as Indonesia, India, Pakistan and do we ask for another country to organise another Gathering and invite India, Pakistan, Indonesia, Philippines and Sri Lanka and possibly sponsor a member from these countries.

Australia nominated to hold the next Gathering in Brisbane in 1978.

All members agreed that it was a very successful gathering and New Zealand were excellent hosts.

1978 26th-29th May Alexandra Headland Queensland Australia

This Asia Pacific Gathering was to promote meetings, exchanges, visits and actions for the development within Australia, India, Indonesia, New Zealand, Philippines and Pakistan.

Unfortunately all records were lost in the Brisbane floods in 2012 as they were stored in Scout Headquarters and that went underwater by about 30 feet.

1982 23rd-28th September Pune India

This gathering was held in Sang am World Centre of WAGGGS with 40 members in attendance.

The gathering consisted of members from Australia (12) Bangladesh (4) Sri Lanka (6) and India (14 plus day visitors) and observers from Malaysia Trefoil Guild (3) who spoke of forming a FOFSAG with the Malaysian Baden Powell Guild. The first Asia Pacific Region committee was elected and it was : Chairman Dr. Perin Banker India and Members Miss Amy Bush Australia, Bro S. De' Silva Bangladesh, Mrs. N. Marsh New Zealand, Mr. Manuel Benipayo Philippines, Mrs. Naqi Pakistan, Prof Dr. Sutarman Indonesia. Lengthy discussions although informal were held and it was decided that the Asia Pacific Region has the potential to expand and become one of the biggest Regions within FOFSAG. Sri Lanka Volunteered to hold the next gathering in 1984

1984 30th July-04th August Bentota Colombo Sri Lanka

The Foundation Institute was the setting for this gathering and with 8 countries represented it was pleasing to see that these gatherings are gathering momentum with representatives from Australia, Bangladesh, India, New Zealand, Pakistan and Sri Lanka along with observers from Austria, United Kingdom, Hong Kong, Malaysia and Singapore. This gathering allocated each day to a country for them to present their activities and each country High Commissioner hosted the gathering to a morning tea on their countries day. This really showed each countries culture and was very well received by all in attendance. The theme for the gathering was “What program would you plan for the betterment of shanty dwellers”. IFOFSAG members were delegated to devote their spare time in

these areas with the main objectives being : Water, Social law, Community halls, Educational programs, Adult education, Crèche to be supported by FOFSAG members to feed, clothe and educate children, Motivate parents, Sport, Money management- budgeting, A new committee was elected with : Chairman ABM Khairul Alam Bangladesh and Members Mrs. June Gillies Australia, TBA Bangladesh, Shri G. Sivappa India, Mrs. Olga Plank New Zealand, Mr. Ifikhar Ahmed Pakistan, Mrs. Delini Peiris Sri Lanka and Observers : Henrietta Chen Hong Kong, Siti Aizah Zahari Malaysia, Miss Shanti Govindan Singapore, Shri Narandra India.

1986 Bangladesh

This gathering was cancelled due to unrest in the Asia Pacific region

1988 04th-08th July Bandung Indonesia

The opening ceremony was held in the State Palace with over 300 present. First and foremost were the participants, plus officials from Government and local authorities. It was opened by Madam Tien Soeharto the first lady of Indonesia and broadcast on both radio and television. Countries attending were: New Zealand, Australia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Bangladesh, India. With 165 FOFSAG members in attendance the theme of the gathering was "Scouting key to a better Society". All members participated in discussion sessions and a cultural evening was held and enjoyed by all. A discussion was held as to why should the chairman have to come from the next host country with emails and if someone was keen to take the position he should not be excluded from holding that position even if he does not come from the next host country. It was moved and seconded that the chairman does not have to come from the next host country. The new committee was elected and was : Chairman Mr. Rameshwar MP India, Members : Mrs. S. Christie Australia, Mr. A.S. Ahmed Bangladesh, Mr. A. Soewarma Indonesia, Mrs. O.W. Plank New Zealand, TBA Malaysia. The committee was asked to make contact with Pakistan, Philippines and Sri Lanka. In future for all gatherings all countries to receive accurate registration forms and must be circulated to all members. India offered to host the 1990 gathering in October in possibly Bombay and the venue to be confirmed. It was agreed that the Asia Pacific region remain as one and the World Bureau to be notified.

1990 02nd-09th November Vithal Bhai Patel House Complex New Delhi

Members in attendance were from Australia, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore and India with 150 members in attendance. Displays and exhibits by countries were mainly relating to scouting and guiding. Plenty of discussion was held on the future direction of the countries and all agreed that the FOFSAG movement would grow. It was voted and passed that the gatherings be held every 2 years and the next one in 1992 and it was requested that Pakistan hold the next gathering but as they were not present their confirmation needed to be sought by the 31/01/1991. A phone call confirmed Pakistan had tentatively agreed to hold the gathering. If they declined Australia should be approached to hold it. Australia agreed to the proposal A call went out for all countries to nominate a candidate to stand for the new committee and this is the new committee The current chairman will continue until a new committee is elected and the one will be elected chairman : Chairman Mr. Wadood A. Jilani Pakistan, Members: Mr. V. Rajaraman India, Mrs. M. Wahjudi Indonesia, Mr. J. Dryden Australia, Mrs. J. Weston New Zealand, Mrs. Delini Peiris Sri Lanka and Observers : Mr. Govind Swary Fiji, Mrs. Rohini Edirisinha Sri Lanka, Mrs. Val Watt Australia, Mrs. Gladys Carlon New Zealand, Mrs. Margaret Murray Australia, Mrs. Lois Smith New Zealand, Mrs. Marjorie Wood Australia. It was agreed that Mr. Jim Dryden be elected for chairman for the next term from all candidates standing

1994 17th-21st January Canberra Australia

Numbers were down due to the political unrest in some countries and only 44 members were in

attendance. Sri Lanka (9), New Zealand (15) Pakistan (1) India (4) and Australia (15).It was moved and passed that the gatherings be held every 3 years in future and that it be the year following a World Conference. All agreed.

1997 10th-14th August Marang Safaris & Resort Terengganu Malaysia

The theme for this gathering was “ Bridging the generation gap through Scouting and Guiding”. The opening was attended by 7 member countries Australia, Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, New Zealand and Malaysia along with observers from Denmark, Italy and the Philippines. There were 200 members and guests at the opening ceremony. Mr. Tajinder Singh, organising chairman and president of FOSAG Malaysia welcomed all members and was honored to be given the opportunity to host the gathering for the first time in Malaysia .The committee was formed prior to the gathering due to Pakistan not being able to hold the gathering. The new committee was: Chairman Mr. J. Dryden Australia and Members: Mrs. M. Murray Australia,Mr. M.J. SattarBangladesh, Dr. A. Kurnia MA Indonesia,Mr. V. Rajaraman India, Mr. Tajinder Singh Malaysia, Mrs. Lois Smith New Zealand, Mrs. Silvia De Silva Sri Lanka and Observers : Mr. John Parker Australia, Mrs. M. Wahjudi Indonesia,Mrs. Amma Soewarma Indonesia, Mrs. Soeharto Sepoetra Indonesia,Mr. Ajay Raman India, Mr. Foong Siew Loong Malaysia, Mr. Surendra Agarwal FOSAG World Committee. It was agreed that all member countries be invoiced for US20 for FOSAG- Asia Pacific account. Papers were presented on Training program, AHM Presentation, Theme speaker,Participants were divided into groups to discuss the theme papers and important factors were; Growth sharing Understanding NGS, Giving due recognition Keeping the lines of communication open, Be sincere, Be a role model. The gathering was voted a great success and all agreed that programs should be brief and avoid dragging on. Tours were organised for the Batek and Songket factories to see how these materials are made as well as some shopping. The closing ceremony concluded with the handing over of the Asia Pacific flag to New Zealand for they will host the next gathering in 2000. The grand final was a fellowship evening on the lawns of the resort with a barbeque.

2000 Napier New Zealand

2003 15th-19th September Sydney Australia

The organising committee held 9 meetings and had everything in place including accommodation, badges and scarves and then on the 14th April 2003 when the airlines stopped travelling to the Asian Countries it was decided to cancel the gathering as only 15 applications had been received at the closing date. It was very fortunate that Spotlight arranged a buy back of the material for the scarves and the badges were sold without any loss and the hotel returned the deposit and all monies due to registrants has been returned. It was regrettable that it had to be cancelled but Australia cannot be held for responsible for the outbreak of SARS epidemic and will probably apply again in the future.

2003-2008 FOSAG Asia pacific was in limbo due to various reasons and it was not until 2008 in Vienna Austria that it was resurrected.

2007 ISGF as it is now know (previously FOSAG) the World Bureau issued guidelines for holding gatherings.And we are now adhering to these guidelings.

2008 At the World Conference in Vienna Austria an informal meeting was held in the cloisters of the University during a break in the conference proceedings and was attended by members from Malaysia, New Zealand, India, Bangladesh and Australia. After a lengthy discussion it was agreed that we would reform the Asia Pacific Region and a gathering would be held every 3 years in the year following a World Conference. Malaysia volunteered to hold the next gathering in 2009 in Malaysia. They only had 12 months to organise it but they said that was plenty of time so everyone left looking

forward to Kuala Lumpur in 2009.

2009 16th-21st July Selesa Resort Kuala Lumpur Malaysia

As this was the first gathering since 2000, it was a very informal affair with more fellowship than a formal gathering. The opening ceremony was spectacular with a flag parade and official welcome by the chairman of ISGF Malaysia and also in attendance were members of Scouts Malaysia. Countries in attendance were Malaysia, Australia, Bangladesh, New Zealand, India Pakistan and Japan along with observers from Tunisia and Maldives. Two options were put forward for the running of the Asia Pacific region and it was proposed that the region committee led by the chairman, secretary and treasurer will be from Malaysia and will liaise with the next host country. Bangladesh agreed to host the 2012 gathering in Dhaka. An ad hoc committee was formed with the International Secretary of each country NSGF to be the liaison person for correspondence and any information regarding the Asia Pacific region. Each country was requested to bring the name of a person from their country to stand on a committee that will be formed in Bangladesh. Funds for the Regional Committee will be from the 3000Euro grant from World Bureau and will be returned to the World Bureau at the end of the gathering to be used by the next host country. Bangladesh will give a written response on the acceptance and failing to do so Australia will take over as host country. The program was well attended by all participants with free time taken to discussion groups. A visit to the Zonice Scout Centre where each country planted a tree in recognition of their visit as well as the Batu Caves and was concluded with a dinner in the Batu Caves Cultural clove. A golf tournament and tours highlighted the gathering with a campfire to close off the gathering.

2012 06th-11th November Dhaka Bangladesh

There were 70 members in attendance along with 1 member from Indonesia who was warmly welcomed after a long absence from ISGF in that country. We had the pleasure to welcome 2 members from the World Committee in Chairman Mida Rodrigues and the member liaising with the Asia Pacific Region on the World Committee Virginia Bonescale. A draft constitution was discussed and all agreed that it was a starting point and amendments had to be made and an updated version would be tabled in India after the committee had agreed to the amendments. Australia and Malaysia donated money and made arrangements for first aid kits, soccer balls, blankets to be delivered to the gathering and were presented to the Scouts and Guides at their headquarters when we visited them during the gathering. 20 sewing machines were also ordered and these were presented to disadvantaged women so they could make cloths for themselves as well as to sell. A 10 person rickshaw was also ordered to convey disabled children to school and home again.

Blankets were given to a group of mentally handicapped children and they showed their appreciation by dancing and playing instruments for us. All members appreciated their gesture.

During the gathering the first new committee since 1990 was elected and they were : Chairman Mr. Satish Khanna India, Vice Chairman Mr. M.D. Khaliq Bangladesh and Elected members Mr. Richard Stuart Smith Australia, Mr. Mike Crane New Zealand, Mr. M.A.K. Mecci India (Secretary), Mr. T. Gunaseelan Malaysia (Treasurer), Mr. Akbar Reza Bangladesh, Mrs. Muneera Mistry India, Mrs. Dayang Mariani Abang-Zain Borneo, Mr. Brian Jackson Australia (Invited Member), Mr. Brett Grant Australia (Invited Member), Mr. Abdullan Rasheed W.O.S.M. Advisor. The 1st Committee meeting will be held in Delhi India in March 2013. A farewell dinner and campfire concluded a very successful gathering with India offering to host the 2015 gathering in September in Bangalore. Gifts were exchanged and the host thanked by each country in attendance.

2013 27th-28th March New Delhi India (Committee meeting)

There were 7 committee members in attendance at the 1st committee meeting held with the new

committee and they came from India, Bangladesh, Malaysia and Australia.

A logo has been designed and a sample forwarded to all committee members for their approval and a decision will be made at the next committee meeting for its approval. An official website has been set up and it is aspac.sgf@gmail.com as well as face book AsPac ISGF Group plus a twitter account and Skype. The treasurer will set up a bank account in Kuala Lumpur in the name of AsPac SGF Region and will be operable from New Delhi India. Signatories will be Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary. The logo as proposed was accepted by all member countries and the region to be officially known as AsPac ISGF Region. All member countries will pay an annual fee of US100 plus a contribution of US100 a total of US200. The world Bureau offered to extend financial support and to begin with the amount agreed by the World Committee Chairman Ms. Mida Rodrigues during the Bangladesh gathering. Fundraising will also be initiated. The next committee meeting will be in Manila Philippines in January 2014.

2014 01st-02nd February Manila Philippines (Committee Meeting)

With 6 committee members in attendance from India, Australia and Malaysia along with an observer from Maldives the meeting opened. The main topic on the agenda was the establishment of an NSGF in the Philippines and the senior Vice president of the Boy scouts of the Philippines assured us that the Boy scouts of the Philippines will in principle establish ISGF in the Philippines and a decision will be taken after an Executive Board Meeting. He assured us that a decision and action on ISGF will be positive. It was moved that a foundation be set up to strengthen the finances of the AsPac region and become independent financially and a committee was elected of a member from Malaysia, Australia and India. The constitution was discussed and Australia said they felt the need for a stronger constitution for the region. A committee was appointed from Australia, India and the Maldives to do a redraft and present it during the region meeting at the World conference in Sydney with the idea of having it approved at the next region gathering in Bangalore in 2015.

The chairman's closing remarks were very clear as he said " Enough talking has been done and now we need actions " All agreed and every one left on a very positive note. We were taken on a tour of the Coconut Palace, former residence of Mrs. Imelda Marcos and now the office and residence of his Excellency Mr. Jejomar Binay, Vice President of the Philippines and we enjoyed its opulence. In the afternoon Mr. Mecci and Mr. Jackson visited Guide headquarters and handed over mementos and souvenirs and spoke about the 27th world Conference in Sydney in 2014.

2015 27th-28th March Kuala Lumpur Malaysia (Committee Meeting)

Members from Australia, India, Indonesia, and Malaysia along with invited members from Bangladesh, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka plus representatives from APR WOSM and APR WAGGGS were all made welcome by the host country representative Mr. Gunaseelan at the new headquarters of APR WOSM. The constitution was reviewed and the new amendments to be proposed were discussed and a new draft circulated. NSGF's are required to send feedback for updating of constitution. Work relations with APR WOSM were very fruitful and they have appointed Mr. Janaprith Fernando as co-coordinator representative with AsPac ISGF. Vision 2024 was presented and suggestions were invited from all NSGF's to be discussed in Bangalore. Committee elections will be held in Bangalore and members felt the draft prepared for the constitution amendments should have clear guidelines for the election and same should be amended. Pakistan has rejoined ISGF with Nepal and Sri Lanka working towards becoming new ISGF. Hong Kong, Korea, Thailand is being approached to form their own NSGF and become members of ISGF.

A very successful and fruitful committee meeting was adjourned and we will convene again in Bangalore and all agreed that with Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Nepal all joining we will be a very strong region.
