Juan attends COP27 Climate Conference

Central branch member Juan Davila Y Verdin attended the COP27 climate change conference in Sharm El-Sheikh Egypt.

Juan Francisco Dávila from Santa Fe participated as head of delegation for the United Nations University for Peace. Dávila lived in the city of Santa Fe for several years. He is a Bachelor of History at the UNL Faculty of Humanities and Sciences. In Europe, he received a BA in Global Politics and International Relations from Birkbeck College, University of London. He also has an MBA from the International University of Monaco. Most recently, in 2021, Dávila was made a Fellow of the Royal Society for Arts, Manufacturers, and Commerce (RSA), and was elected a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society (RHS) of the United Kingdom. In an interview with El Litoral, the man from Santa Fe made an analysis of how he perceived COP27 in relation to the educational issue. "Sustainable development goal 4 (SDG) that has to do with education for sustainability is somewhat relegated and is hardly mentioned in the COP 27 Conference. They are talking about energy reconversion, implementation, gender, finance, science, but without a solid educational base it is very complex to sustain changes over time."

There is change at the top of the Gibraltar Sea Scouts Pipe Band which, at 106 years old, is the oldest marching band and the only pipe band on the rock: Central branch member Tony Galliano stands down after over 40 years of service leading the band. Taking over from him is his Pipe Sergeant, Tarik El-Yabani.

Pipe Major Tony Galliano joined the 5th Gibraltar Sea Scouts in 1964 and shortly after started learning to play the bagpipes, taught by the then Leading Piper George De Veras, soon after the Royal Ulster Rifles arrived on the Rock and their Pipe Major, Albert Price, took the band under his wing by sending instructors to the band. Tony continued playing and took on other duties within the band and Scout Group. He took over the band as Pipe Major in 1980 from Tony Almeida, who still plays today. Tony has also taken the band to play in many festivals in Asturias and the Costa del Sol in Spain. ISGF 11th European Conference Denmark

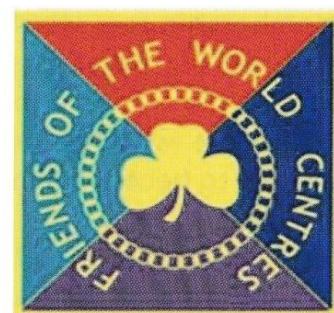
30th July - 3rd August, Ranum Efterskole College
